Agency's primary purpose and its various goals and objectives	
The commission and the committee's primary purpose is to determine the type of continuing education required for sheriffs to complete the requirements of division (E) of section 311.01 of the Revised Code. Additionally, the committee approves the courses offered by OPOTA and third parties that sheriffs may attend to complete the continuing education requirement. OPOT publishes an approved list of those courses on its website for ease of reference. The commission maintains a list of approved trainings that sheriffs may attend to complete the continuing education requirement. Currently, sheriffs are required to complete sixteen (16) hours of continuing education each year under ORC 311.01(E).	

Agency's past and anticipated workload, number of staff required to complete workload, and total number of staff		
The Ohio Attorney General's office does not supply direct support in the way of staffing or resources to the Committee.		

Agency's past and anticipated budgets and its sources of funding	
Members of the continuing education committee do not receive compensation for their service on the committee. The budget of the Ohio Attorney General's Office does not financially support the needs of the Committee.	

Number of members of its governing board or other governing entity and their compensation, if any
There are no fewer than five (5) and no more than seven (7) members of the Committee per ORC 109.80 (B). Including but not limited to representatives from the Ohio Peace Officer Training commission and sheriffs of Ohio. Members are recommended by the Buckeye States Sheriffs Association to the Attorney General who makes the official appointment. Currently there are six (6) sheriffs on the Committee. There is no compensation for participating as a member of this Committee from state resources.
